

## Block 18 – Els Feteris

### General instructions :

The measurements given for cutting include seam allowances of 7 mm ( $\frac{1}{4}$ " ), rounded to 15 mm ( $\frac{1}{4}$ " ) for two seams. Make any necessary adjustments.

The measurements in the explanatory diagrams do not include seam allowances.

The raw-edge technique is used for the appliqués. Do not add a seam allowance to the templates. Trace each shape onto the smooth side of the double-sided fusible web. Make sure that each piece is in the right direction so that it is identical to the pattern on the right side. Loosely cut around each marked piece. With a hot iron and using steam, fuse each piece to the wrong side of fabric of sufficient size. Then cut the layers on the marked line.

### Cutting :

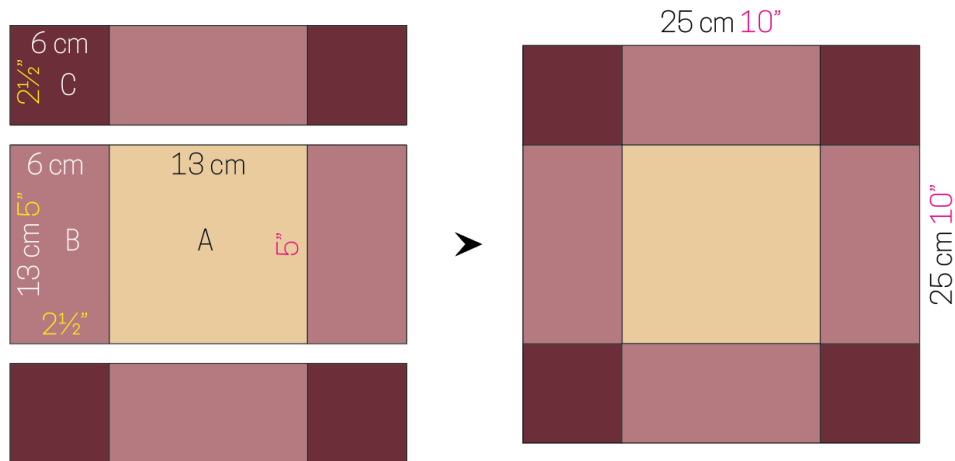
Number your fabrics for easier identification.

- From one Fabric 1, beige, cut the following:
  - one 14.5 cm ( $5\frac{1}{2}$ " ) A square
- From one Fabric 2, light red with checks:
  - four 7.5 x 14.5 cm ( $3$ " x  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " ) B rectangles
- From one Fabric 3, dark red with stripes:
  - four 7.5 cm ( $3$ " ) C squares
- From one Fabric 4, pink:
  - four of heart 1
  - three of circle 23
- From one Fabric 5, green:
  - stems 2, 3 and 4
  - three of leaf 5
- From one Fabric 6, bright red:
  - one vase 6
- From one Fabric 7, black:
  - six of circle 7
- From one Fabric 8, purple:
  - petals 8 to 22

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## Assembly :

**Diagram 1:** Stitch one B rectangle to either side of the A square. Stitch one C square to the ends of the remaining B rectangles and add these units to the top and bottom of the previous unit to make the block background.



**Diagram 2:** Remove the paper film from the fusible web lining each appliqué piece. Then referring to the diagram, position the various elements on the right side of the background in the numerical order of the templates. Fuse your pieces with a hot iron, using steam.

Attach each piece with blanket stitch using coordinating embroidery floss.
