



Block 31 – Yvonne Fuchs

General instructions :

The measurements given for cutting include generous seam allowances for paper piecing.

The measurements in the explanatory diagrams do not include seam allowances.

Cutting :

- From one dark red fabric, cut the following:
 - two 6.5 x 11.5 cm ($2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$) rectangles → **one piece 1 and one piece 1'**
- From one red fabric:
 - two 4 x 5 cm ($1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2''$) rectangles → **one triangle 2 and one triangle 2'**
 - two 4 x 6.5 cm ($1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$) rectangles → **one piece 3 and one piece 3'**
 - two 4 x 7.5 cm ($1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3''$) rectangles → **one piece 4 and one piece 4'**
 - two 4 x 11.5 cm ($1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$) rectangles → **one piece 5 and one piece 5'**
- From one dark pink fabric:
 - two 4 x 5 cm ($1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2''$) rectangles → **one triangle 6 and one triangle 6'**
 - two 4 x 6.5 cm ($1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$) rectangles → **one piece 7 and one piece 7'**
 - two 6.5 x 7.5 cm ($2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3''$) rectangles → **one piece 8 and one piece 8'**
 - two 5 x 12.5 cm ($2'' \times 5''$) rectangles → **one piece 9 and one piece 9'**
 - two 10 x 16.5 cm ($4'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$) rectangles → **one piece 10 and one piece 10'**
- From one pink fabric:
 - two 5 x 9 cm ($2'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$) rectangles → **one triangle 11 and one triangle 11'**
 - four 5 x 11.5 cm ($2'' \times 4\frac{1}{2}''$) rectangles → **one piece 12, one piece 14, one piece 12' and one piece 14'**
 - two 5 x 22.5 cm ($2'' \times 9''$) rectangles → **one piece 16 and one piece 16'**
- From one white fabric:
 - two 7.5 cm ($3''$) squares,  → **one triangle 13, one triangle 15, one triangle 13' and one triangle 15'**
 - one 16.5 cm ($6\frac{1}{2}''$) square,  → **one triangle 17 and one triangle 17'**

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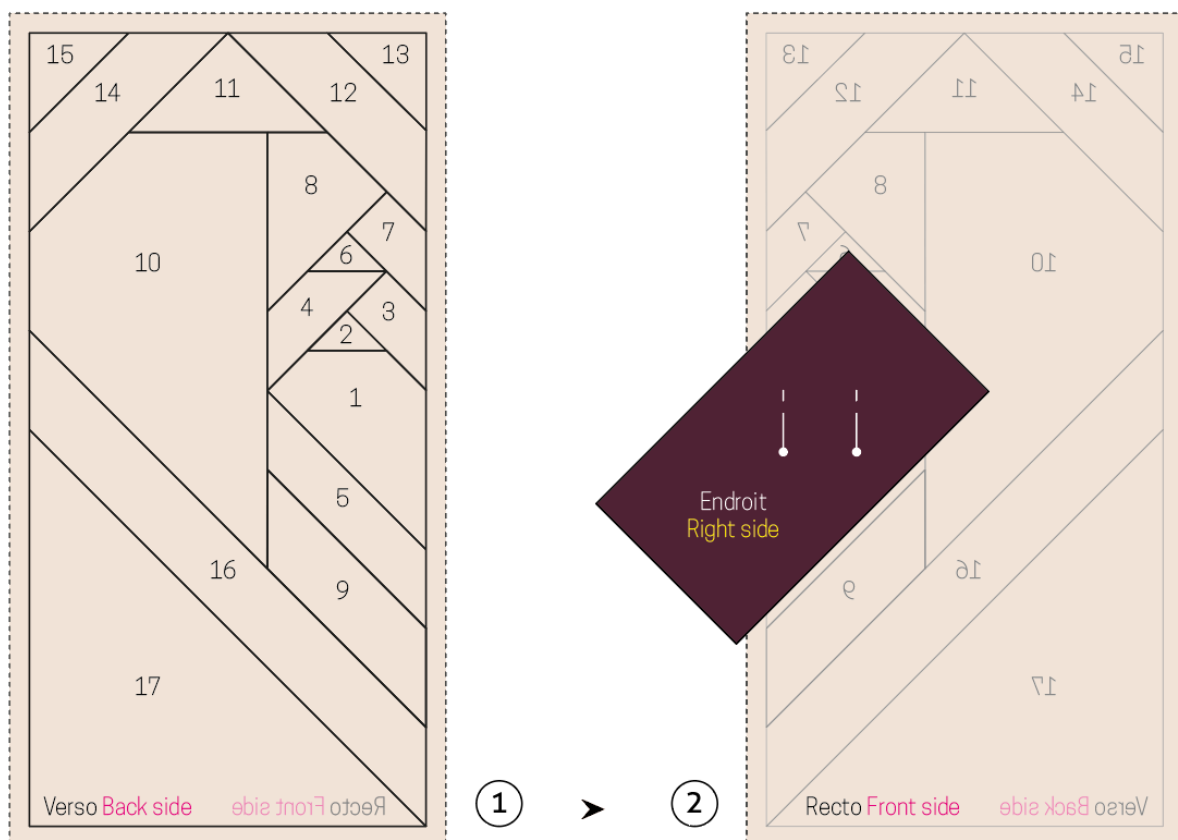
Assembly :

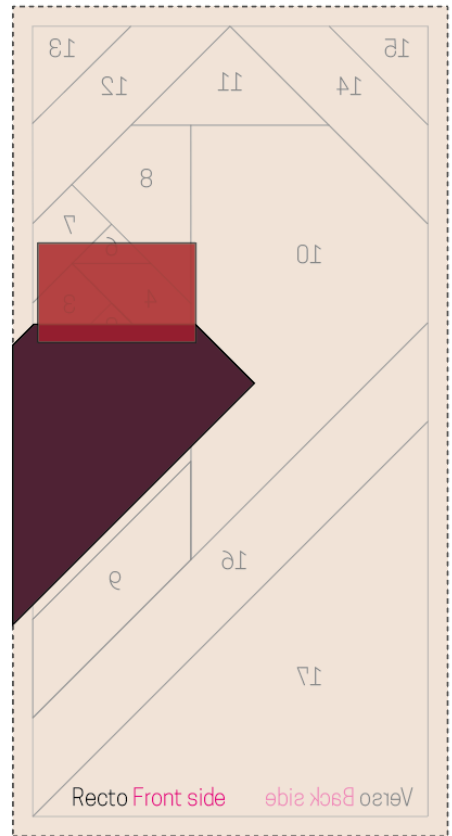
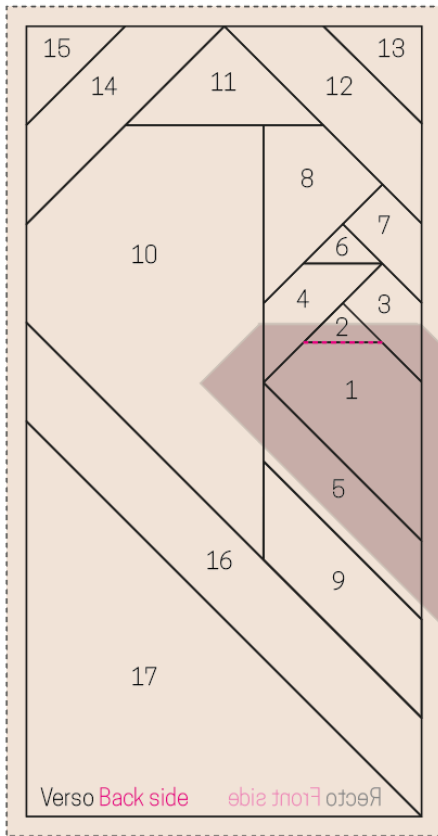
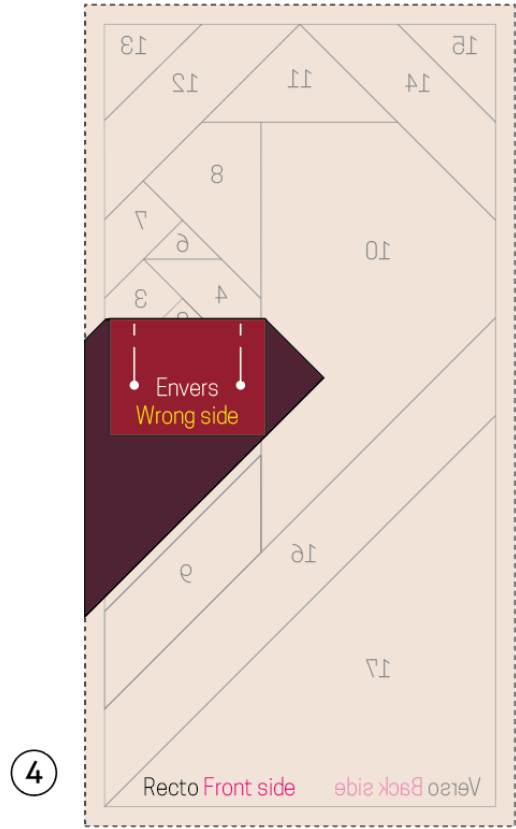
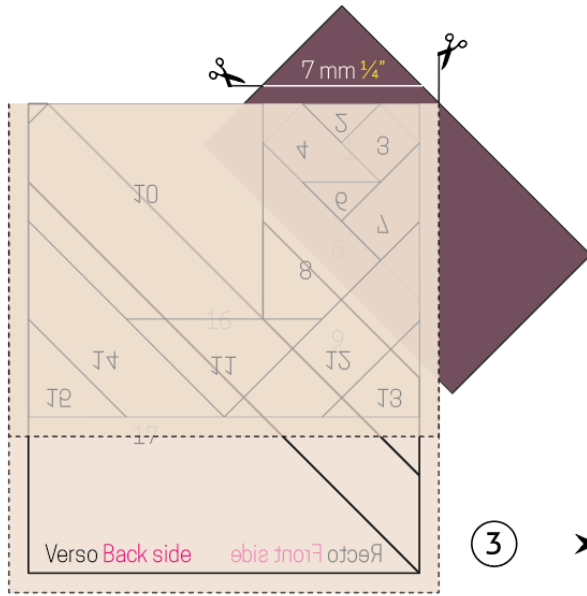
Diagram 1:

1. Transfer the template motif included on the pattern onto one paper rectangle or foundation of your choice. The side with the marking will be the back of the block.
2. Position and pin one dark red rectangle, the wrong side of the fabric facing the front of the paper, so that the marking of piece 1 is fully covered.
3. On the back, fold the paper along the marking between piece 1 and triangle 2. Cut away the excess fabric at 7 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ "). (You can cut away the excess fabric extending over the dotted-line marking on the paper.)
4. On the front, pin one red 4 x 5 cm ($1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2") rectangle, right sides together and edge to edge, making sure that once sewn, the fabric rectangle will fully cover the triangle-2 marking.
5. On the back, stitch along the marking between piece 1 and triangle 2 (marking indicated by red dotted lines on the diagram) with small stitches; this will facilitate removing the paper pieces later.
6. Turn triangle 2.

Repeat steps 3 to 6 to obtain the first part of your block.

Repeat in a symmetrical way to obtain the second.





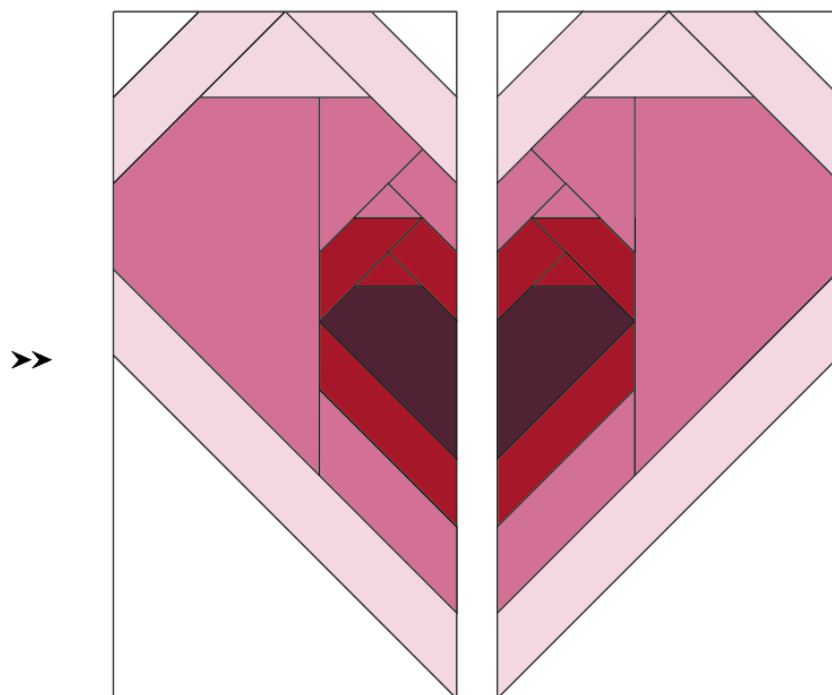


Diagram 2: To assemble your block, stitch together the two parts of your block.
