

Block 37 – Brigitte Heitland

General instructions :

The measurements given for cutting include seam allowances of 7 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ "), rounded to 15 mm ($\frac{1}{4}$ ") for two seams. Make any necessary adjustments.

The measurements in the explanatory diagrams do not include seam allowances.

Cutting key:

◻: Square cut on one diagonal

⊠: Square cut on the two diagonals

For those using the traditional cutting method, note that you will find:

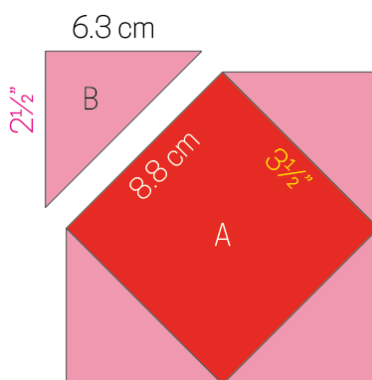
- the templates on the pattern; add seam allowances to them
- the quantities **in bold** in the Cutting section

Cutting :

- From one bright red fabric, cut the following:
 - one 10.3 cm (**4"**) A square
- From one pink fabric:
 - two 8.8 cm (**$3\frac{3}{8}$ "**) squares, ◻ → **four B triangles**
- From one dark red fabric:
 - two 8.8 cm (**$3\frac{3}{8}$ "**) squares, ◻ → **four B triangles**
 - one 16 cm (**$6\frac{1}{4}$ "**) square, ⊠ → **four C triangles**
- From one pale pink fabric for the background:
 - two 8.8 cm (**$3\frac{3}{8}$ "**) squares, ◻ → **four B triangles**
 - one 16 cm (**$6\frac{1}{4}$ "**) square, ⊠ → **four C triangles**

Assembly :

Diagram 1: Stitch one pink B triangle to each side of the A square to obtain one Square-in-a-square block.



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Diagram 2: Stitch one dark red B triangle to either side of one pale pink C triangle. Repeat and stitch the flying geese blocks obtained to either side of the Square-in-a-square block.

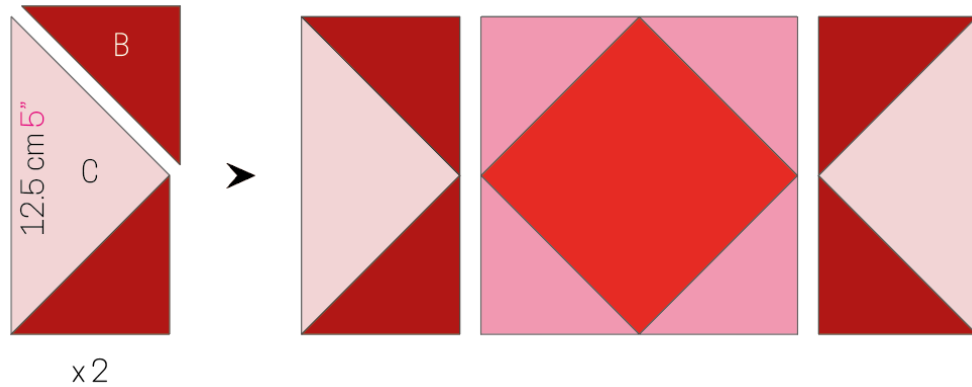


Diagram 3: Stitch one pale pink B triangle and one dark red C triangle to either side of one pale pink C triangle. Repeat and join these rows obtained to the top and bottom.
